Things are changing around us. This LENTEN Journey is (hopefully), starting to wake us up "inside ourselves", and we also are starting to see things changing "outside ourselves"; in the weather, length of daylight, the first break of flowers through the ground or the warmth of the sun shining on us. Some of the things that are changing we can have some control over; the time spent in prayer, Hail Marys' being said, fasting, quiet

time, adding weekday mass once a week or more. However, most of what happens during this LENTEN journey, (and in life too), we have no control over and that is the most difficult part. We have no control over what happens in the world around us, the people around us, situations or history about us. We know there is a great deal that we can't control, so I wonder, is the purpose of all this to see how we ACT when we have no control? What is our response? Do we have a failure attitude? ("doesn't matter anyway"), or do we look at others to change ("not my fault!"), or do we ignore reality ('it's all good, really") or do we react with faith? ("God's got this and I need to learn something about myself through this experience"). This is similar to our Gospel reading today, where Mary and Martha had no control over Lazarus dying, nor over Jesus' decision to delay his travel for 2 days before returning to them. How did Mary and Martha choose to ACT in this emotional situation? They acted with faithfulness in spite of the loss of their brother Lazarus. They acted with reverence to Jesus' arrival by meeting him, first Martha and then Mary, as he arrived. They acted, in spite of their loss and their hurt, and responded with trust in the Lord, by removing the stone after Jesus asks them to "Take Away the Stone". There is an "older" hymn that is one of my favorites They'll Know We Are Christians". It talks about how others will see us, as we act to experiences in our lives. "By our Love, by our Love" is the rest of that verse. It says we'll "walk hand in hand...work side by side....one in the spirit". So question? At this part of the LENTEN Journey, will the world around us KNOW that we are Christians by our Love? By our "Walk"? By our "Work"? By our "Way we show others"? We can't be Christians to our 'church family' and then treat another religion with impatience or disrespect. We can't be Christians if we get involved with gossip about others or about situations, instead of lifting up those around us. We must be love to all, in all situations. Those dressed in good clothes or those with clothes that haven't been washed in a very long time. Those who can do something for us, and those who could never do anything for us in return. Change will always be a part of our lives, from the littlest of changes to the drastic ones. Change that

we can affect, and change that is thrown on us...sometimes when we think we don't have much strength left. Change is good or bad, depending on how you look at it personally. Let us be more like Martha and Mary, in our response to change that happens to us and even more the changes that we are experiencing this LENT. Let us be faithful in spite of loss; let us be reverent in spite of pain; let us be trusting in spite of the unknown and let us be in love with the possibilities that Jesus has for us, as we journey through this LENT and Easter season, honoring and loving God. Let us "show we are Christians, by our love, by our love!!" <3 Glenna xo



#### "Make confession more available": From Vatican News Feeds Internet

"Hear confessions every time someone asks," Pope Francis says, and don't ever put limited hours on the Sacrament of Reconciliation. "Please, let there never be those signs that say, 'Confessions: Mondays and Wednesdays from this time to that time," he told hundreds of confessors and other participants attending an annual course sponsored by the Apostolic Penitentiary, a Vatican court that handles issues related to the absolution of sin. "Hear confession every time someone asks you.



And if you are sitting there, praying, leave the confessional open because God's heart is open," he said March 17. Confession "is a pastoral priority," and is a daily call to head to the "peripheries of evil and sin, and this is an ugly periphery," he said. "I'll confess," he told his audience, that the Apostolic Penitentiary "is the tribunal that I really like because it is a 'tribunal of mercy,' where one goes to get that indispensable medicine for our souls, which is divine mercy." Be ready to use confession as an opportunity to evangelize and remind people of the basic, essential truth of faith and morality, he told them.
